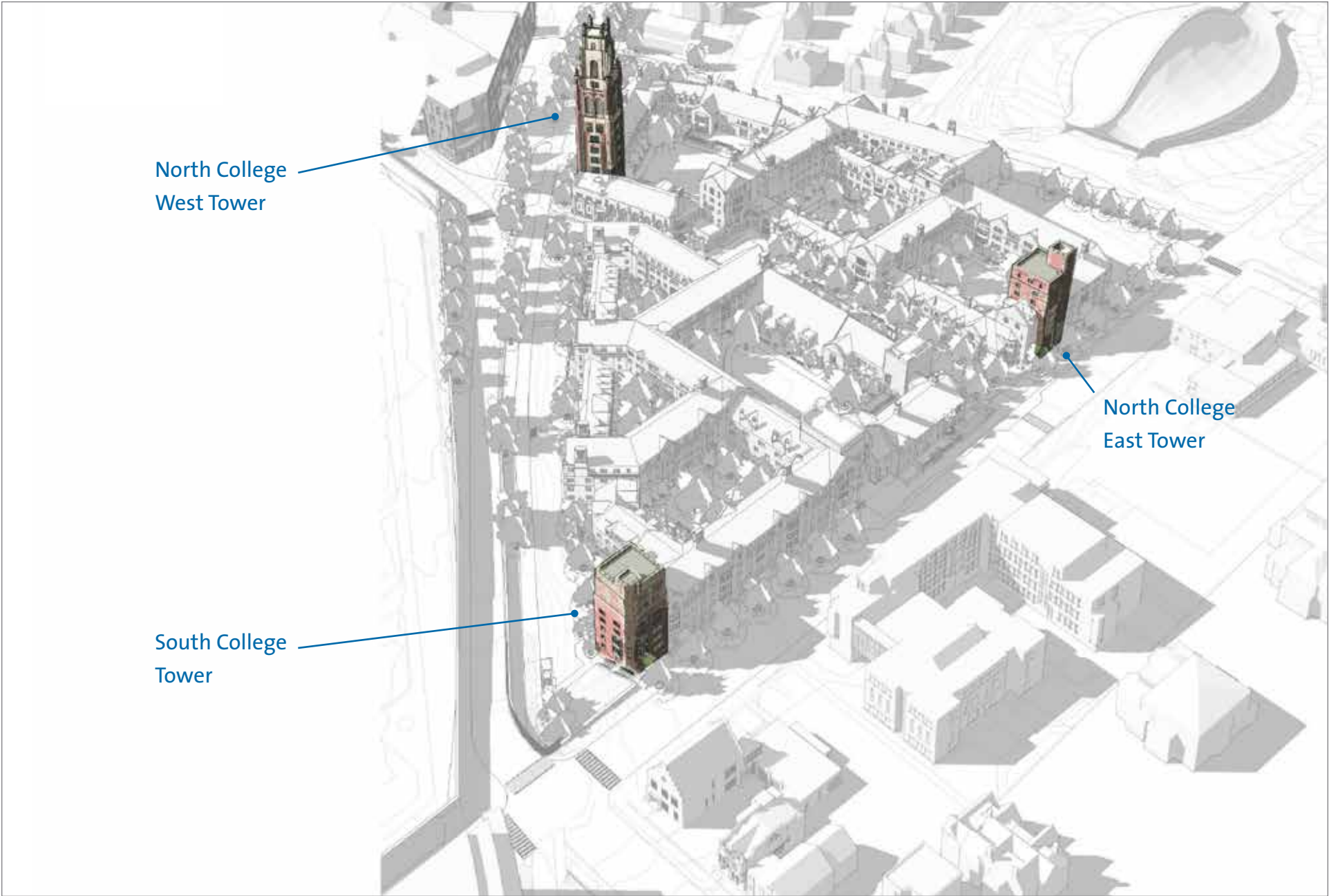

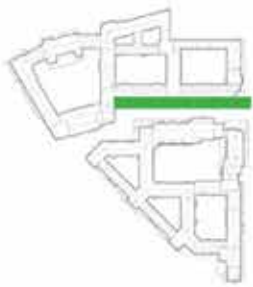

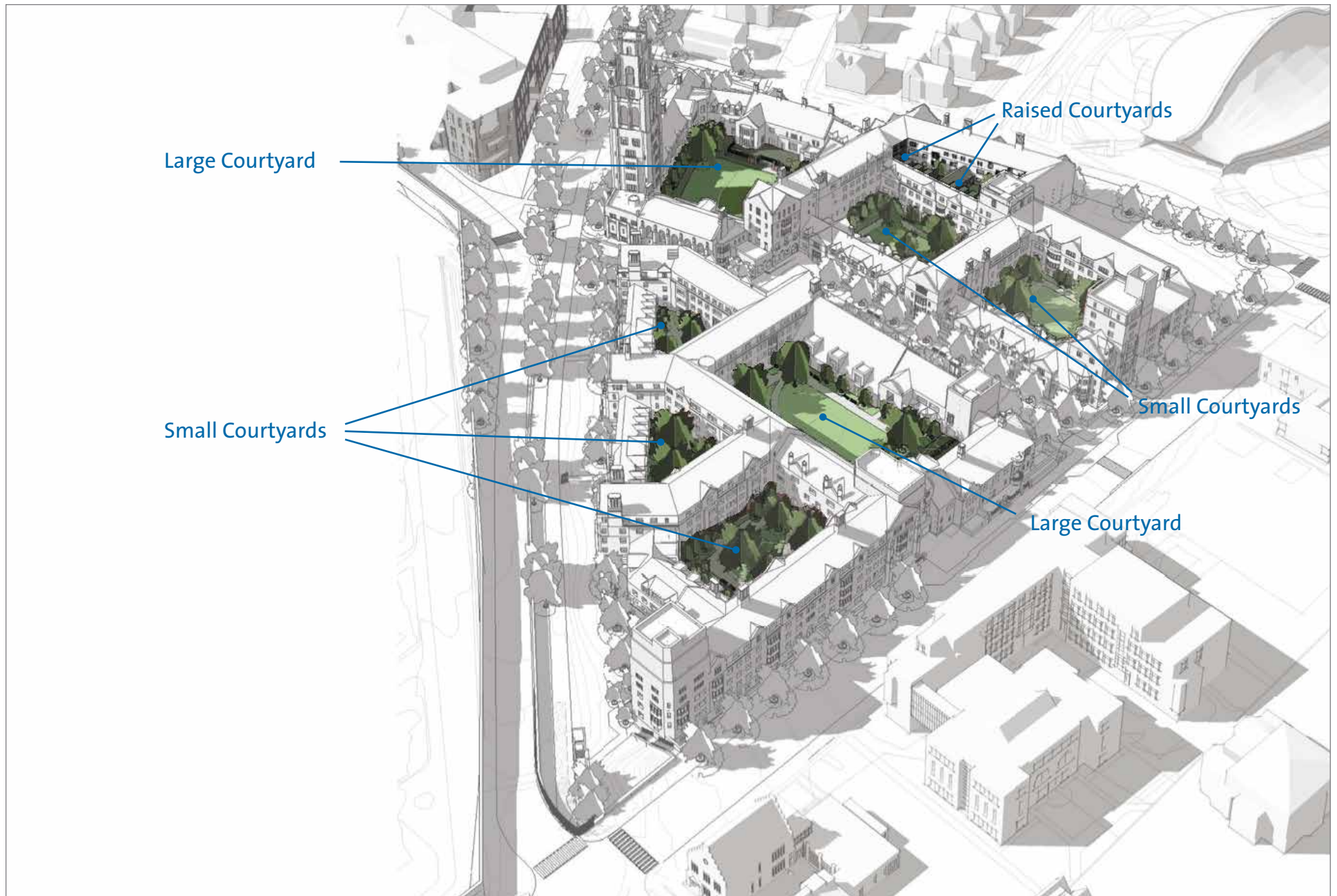

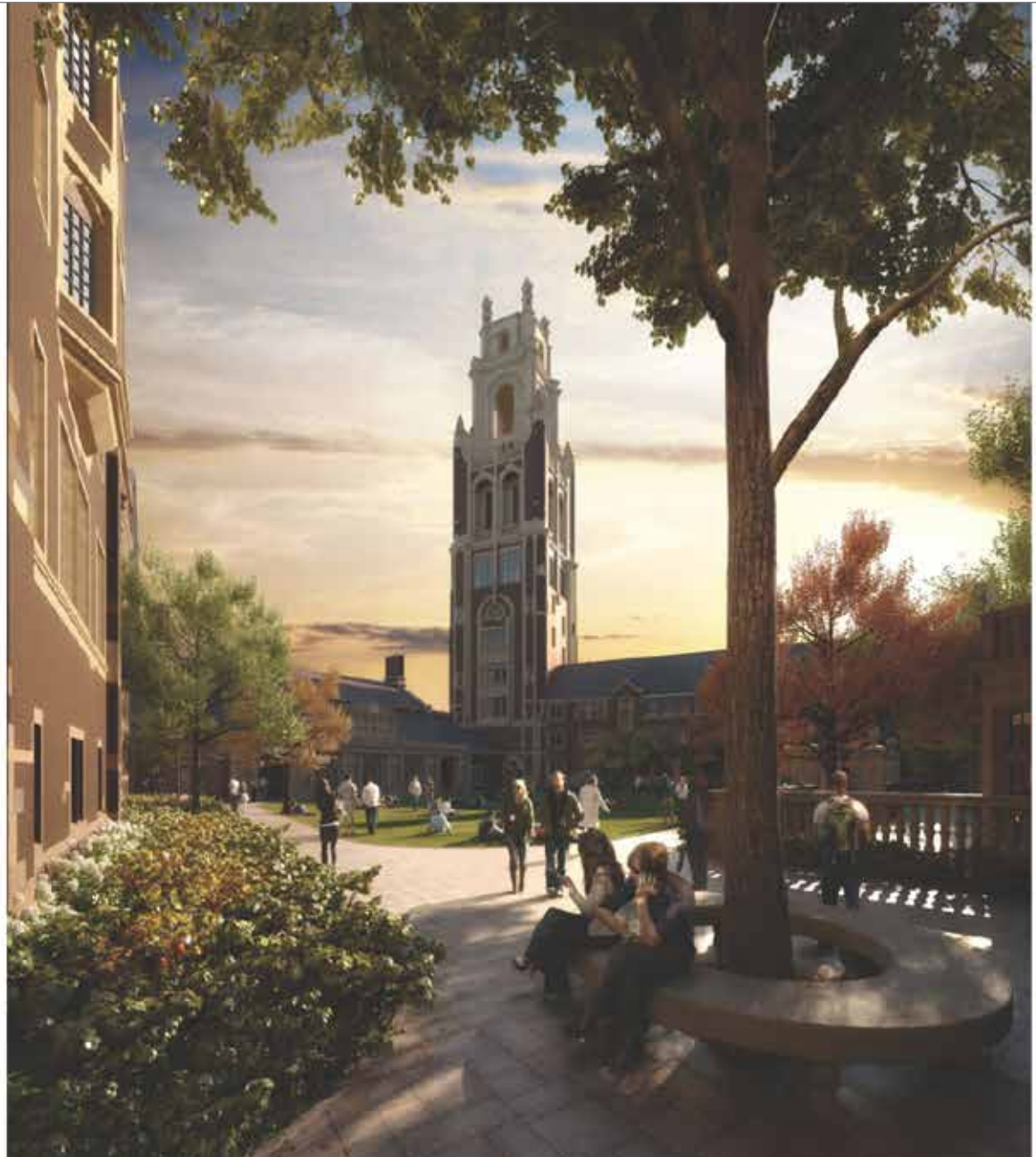

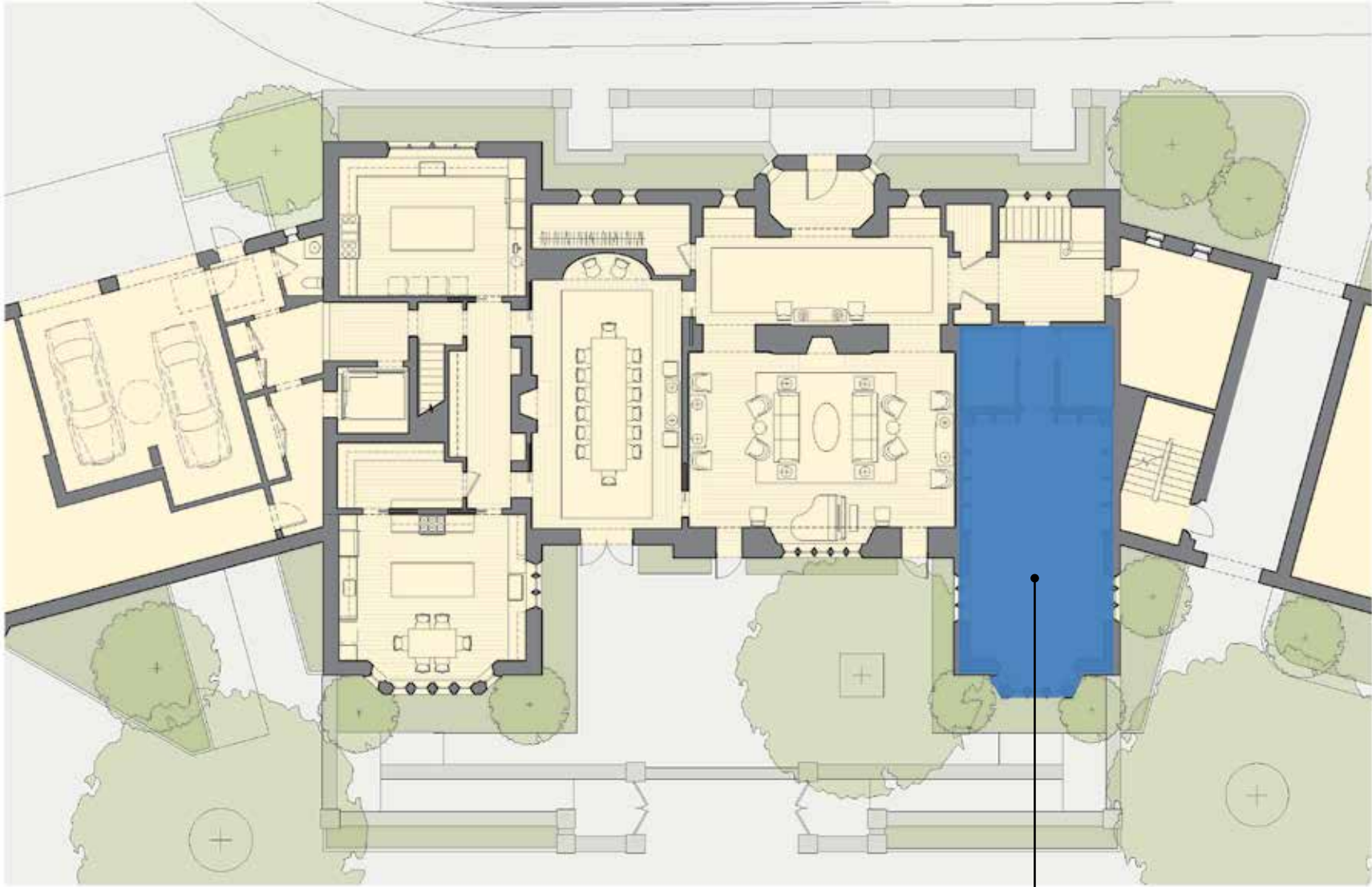

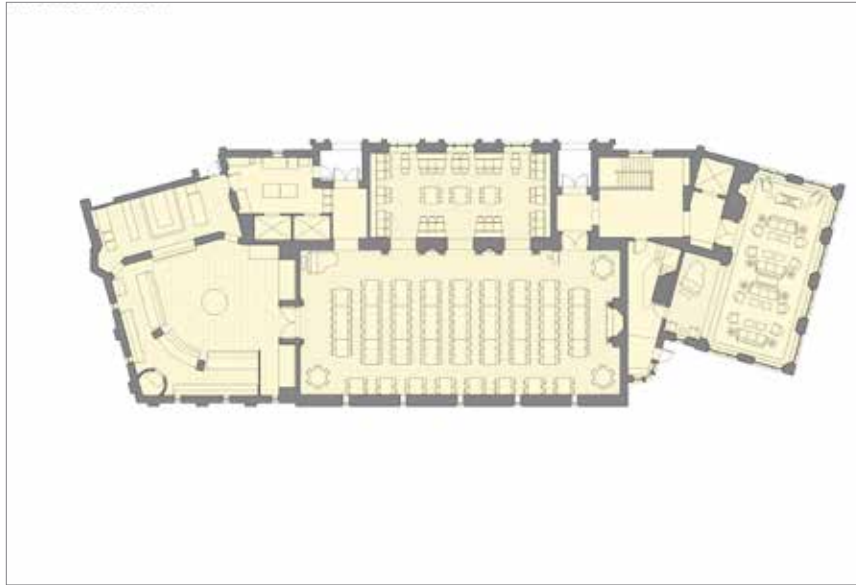

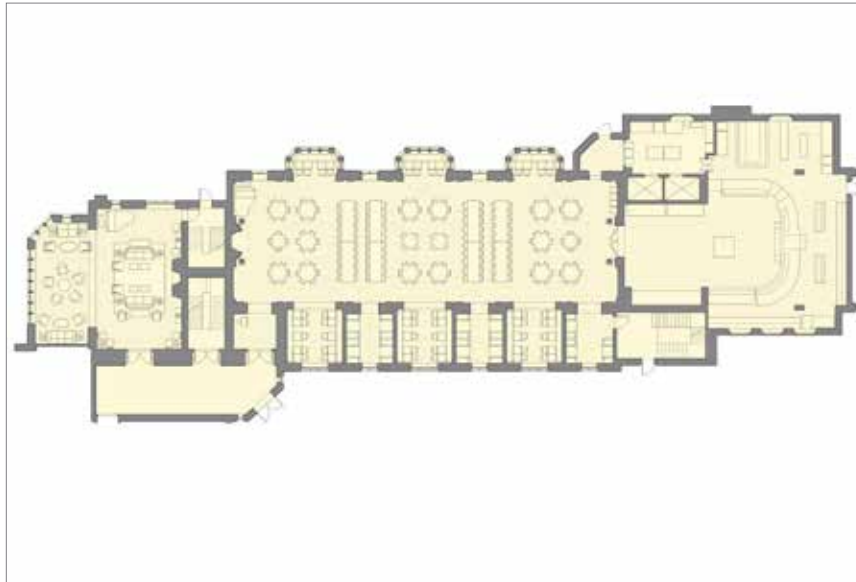

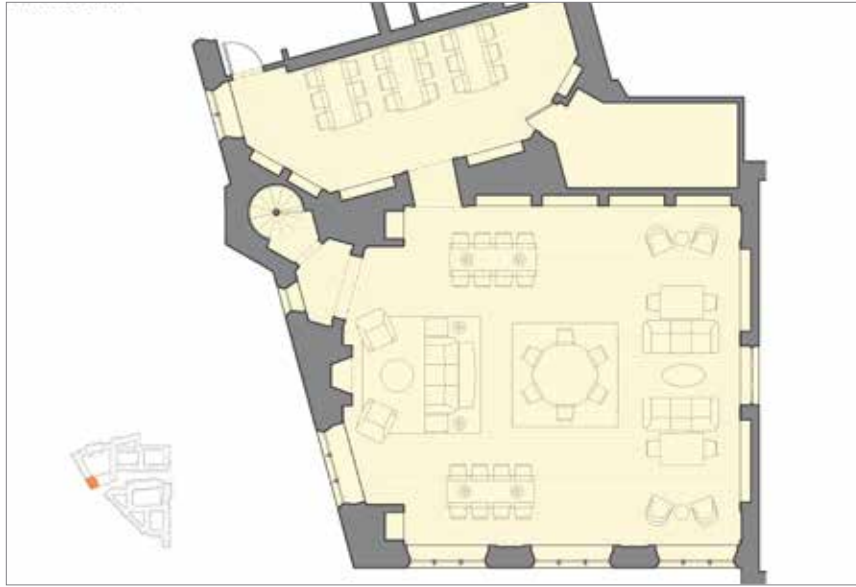

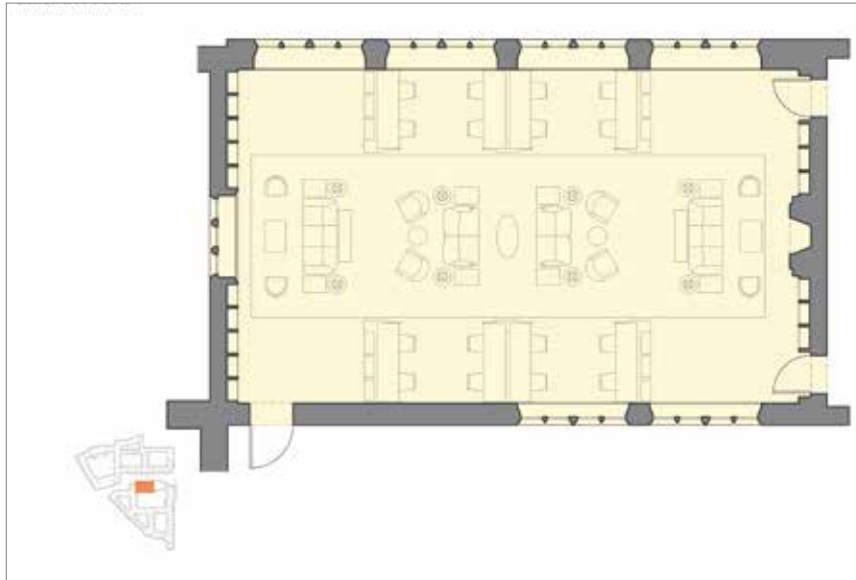

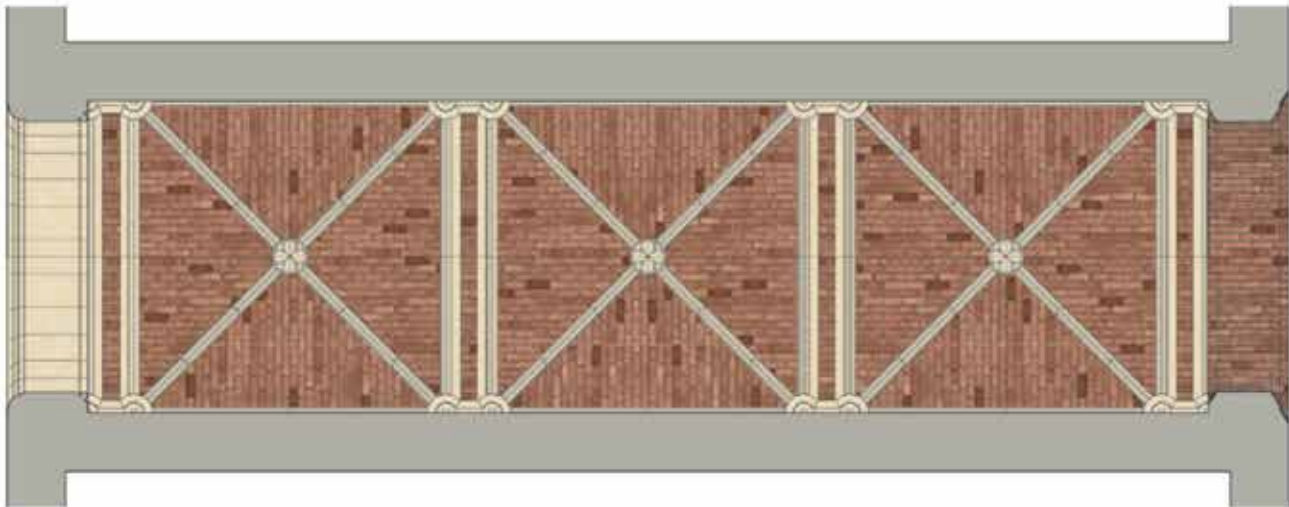

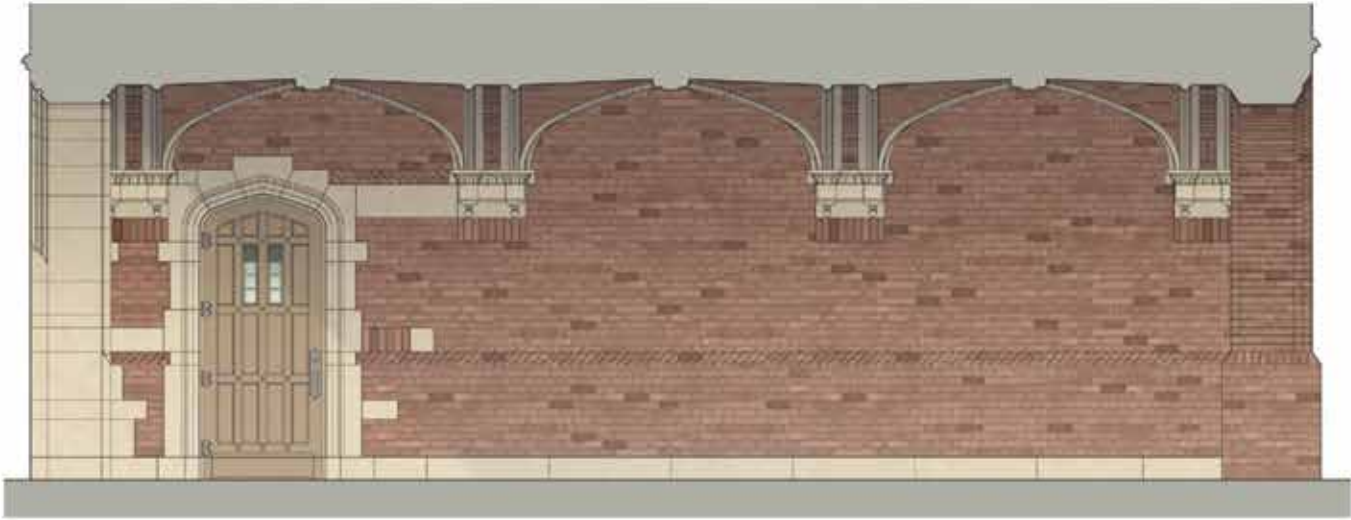
South College Prospect Street Gate

Reflected Ceiling Plan

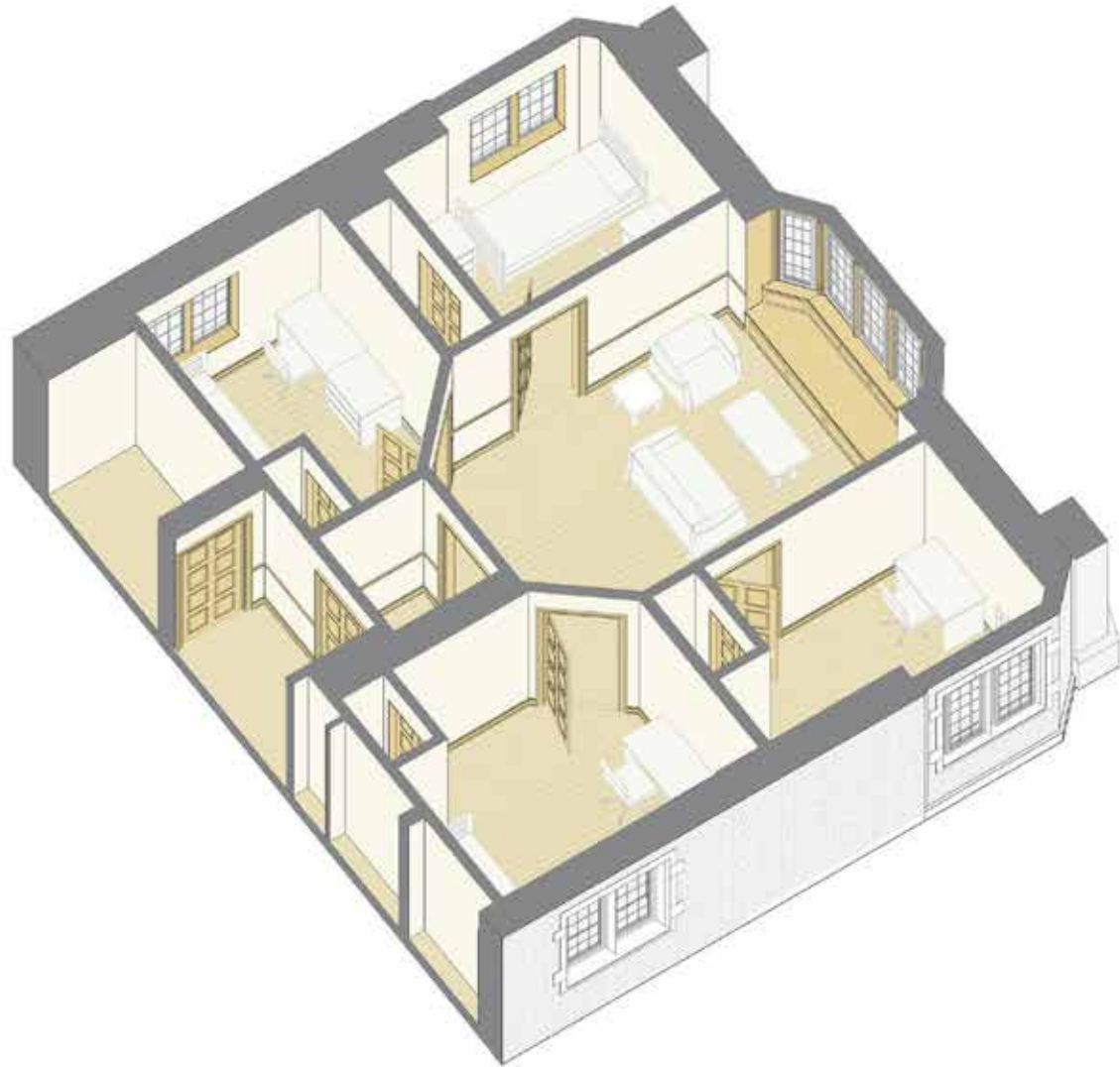

Yale University Residential Colleges, North and South *Giving Opportunities*

The new residential colleges will emulate Yale's proven model, with a master, dean, fellows, and students forming a close-knit family, supported by the highest-caliber public and private spaces for living and study.

An area of campus bounded by Sachem, Prospect, and Canal streets will accommodate the colleges. The facilities will use the familiar vernacular of Yale's central campus, incorporating spaces for living, diverse extracurricular pursuits, and academics. The new colleges will expand the undergraduate student body, adding roughly 200 students to each class and relieving pressure on existing facilities.
